* Report to Main Office to receive a Tardy Pass without penalty * Counseling with grade level Counselor


- Students who have a total of five (5) days of Indoor Suspension and/or 15 or more absences and 20 or more days of tardy / excused early will not be allowed to participate in extra curricular activities.
- Additionally, Students with Success Center suspension and/or D's F's in conduct will not be allowed to participate.
- * Please note that for any end of year field trips, students must abide by all these stipulations as well as have a minimum of 4 points in each class by the end of the third nine weeks
 - * The plan of action taken for all other violations will be in accordance to the Miami-Dade County Public Schools Code of Student Conduct.

Behavioral Expectations & Procedures Ms. Taylor, AP



- Students are expected to be in class at ALL times
- Students are required to transition to class on time with NO exceptions
- * 15/15 rule
- Students are required to have a pass when transitioning in the hallway

- Students are expected to line up and sit quietly when in the lunchroom
- * Students are required to stay seated in the lunch room
- Teachers are to walk students down to the lunch room
- Students will leave book bags in class during lunch

Attendance Procedures Mr. Hernandez, Assistant Principal

- * Tardy- If a student is tardy to school they are required to go to Main Office to receive a tardy to school pass.
- * Early Sign-out- If a student is signing out early, parents are required to sign the student out in the attendance office, before 3:20 pm.
- * If you sign out before 11:15am you will be marked absent for the day. Student will need to be in school at least 2 hours in order to be marked as present.
- * Absent- If a student is absent from school they are required to bring a note within 72 hours from their parent/guardian indicating the reason for the absence. Students are to take the "student admit" given to them in homeroom to each class they missed on the days specified.

Academic Requirements Counselors Ms. Rouco (A-L) & Ms. Simmons (M-Z)

- * All 6th grade students must have four core courses:
 - * Language Arts
 - * Mathematics
 - * Social Studies
 - * Science
- * Two Electives that could include:
 - Intensive Reading &/or Intensive Math
 - * Or electives of student choice
- * Students should maintain a C or higher academic average, passing at least 5 classes.
